Due to the sensitive nature of our patient population, all donations must come from a smoke-free environment.

When this happens, we give donations either to the La Tienda Guild Thrift Shop (whose proceeds benefit Valley Children's), or to organizations in our community who work to benefit the lives of children in the Central Valley.
