The nurse will take my temperature.








The nurse will put a cuff around my arm and give it a big hug. It might feel like a squeeze. It won't hurt.

The nurse will listen to my heart.






I get to touch the mask. It feels like a soft balloon. It won't hurt.





I will practice putting the mask on my face. It won't hurt.






The nurse will put on my bracelet.






The nurse will ask my parent lots of questions and type on the computer.


